

British Columbia Announces New Statutory Holiday: National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

On March 9, 2023, the British Columbia provincial government established the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation as a statutory holiday under the British Columbia employment standards legislation. Provincially regulated employees in British Columbia are now entitled to observe September 30 of each year as a paid public holiday.

British Columbia will join Prince Edward Island, the Northwest Territories, Nunavut and the Yukon as jurisdictions that have designated September 30 as a statutory holiday, along with federally regulated employers that also recognize this holiday.
